Performance Notes and Extended Techniques Guide:

Cricket Gliss:



Perform Gliss. above the tuning levers of the harp

Metallic Ringing:



Suppress the pedal of the given note halfway so the tuning lever is touching but not pinching the note, it should produce a rattling effect

Whistling sound:



Run finger nail down the length of the given string.

Rhythmic tapping:



Using four fingers, tap halfway down the soundboard



Strike full hand in between the given notes

Stomp:



Stomp on the ground with whatever foot you chose

Notes for Movement 1:

During the Bisbigliando, you are not restricted to play particularly in time. If the quarter notes underneath the rhythm become uneven or you choose to add or remove a beat or two, that is acceptable.

Notes for Movement 2:

Cadenza like. Exaggerate the glissandos as much as possible. mm. 4 and 5 are a guideline, go nuts Play the Last chord of Movement 3 and the first chord of movement 2. Hold fermati very long

Notes for Movement 3:

Take this movement at whatever tempo is most comfortable to play continuous 8th notes

Notes for Movement 4:

Movement 3 is a free form movement with no given tempo or rhythm. (given rhythms are only a basic guideline.) You should perform it at your own speed and take your time on pedal changes. You may roll any chord as much as you desire. Play the last chord of Movement 3 as the first chord of Movement 4.







